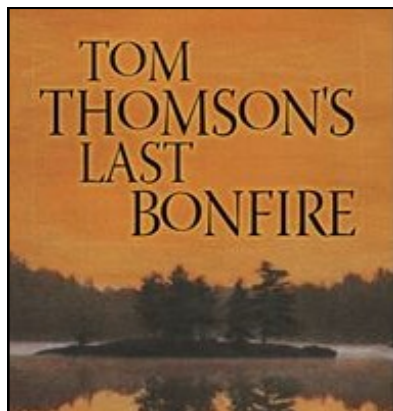

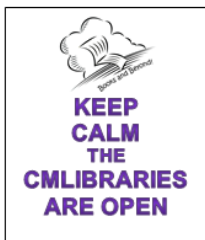

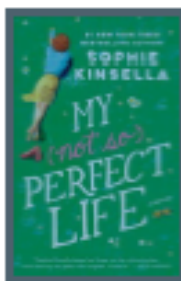

Why be happy when you could be normal? By Jeanette Winterson

Jeanette Winterson is adopted by religious Pentecostal parents in the 1950's. Failing to live up to her mother's expectations Jeanette disappoints her parents over and over. She is locked out of the house and forced to spend the night on the front step of the house or in the coal hole for misbehaving. Her mother rules the house and has Jeanette's father deliver the beatings. Jeanette escapes at 16 moving out of the house to live with a friend and bounce around from couch to couch. Her mother's response to Jeanette loving women is: 'Why be happy when you could be normal?' Jeanette ends up studying at Oxford and trying to heal from her childhood; all the while searching for the birth mother who gave her up years earlier. This book will make you laugh and make you cry. What stands out from this story is Jeanette's resilience - how do you survive this childhood and go on to be a successful adult and writer. After finishing this book I picked up Winterson's first novel - 'Oranges are not the only fruit' which won several awards including the Whitbread Award for Best First Novel.
