

What I'm Reading - Kimberly Lackie

For those who enjoy a substantial historical thriller, the "Thomas de Quincey" series by David Morrell is a must read. The first title in the series is Murder As a Fine Art. This novel set in Victorian London uses Thomas De Quincey, controversial author of "Confessions of an English Opium-Eater" (1821) and "On Murder Considered as One of the Fine Arts" (1827) as the central character in the story.

De Quincey's essay, "On Murder as One of the Fine Arts" dramatized the infamous Ratcliffe Highway killings which terrorised Londoners in 1811, when the inhabitants of both a shop and a tavern were viciously murdered. Now it is 1854 and De Quincey

and his daughter, Emily, are staying in London at the same time as an apparently motiveless murder of an entire family occurs and which mirrors that of the Ratcliffe killings. De Quincey's knowledge of the crimes makes him a key suspect. Desperate to clear his name but crippled by his opium addiction, De Quincey is aided by his devoted daughter and a pair of determined Scotland Yard detectives to stop this "artist of death".

In Inspector of the Dead, the second book in the Thomas de Quincey series, a killer targets members of the British aristocracy, leaving

with each corpse the name of someone who previously attempted to assassinate Queen Victoria.

In Ruler of the Night, the third book in the series, Thomas and his daughter become involved with England's first train murder – a gentleman is fatally stabbed in his safely locked first-class compartment.

David Morrell combines a thrilling murder mystery series and social critique of many aspects of Victorian society.

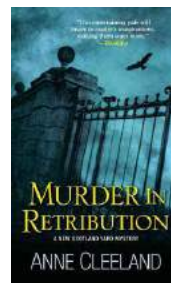
